"But back then I wasn't a believer in the faith I'd been raised in. One re-conversion, one degree in engineering, and one master's degree in theology later, I wanted to do more than write an homage to my favorite sci-fi experiences. I wanted to critique them—to bring the light of faith into the genre, and then see what happens next."
